Chris Boden and Kaitlin Sharkey It's no surprise WGN-Channel 9 waited until Dan Roan retired to announce his successor as sports anchor. But in an unexpected twist, the Nexstar Media station appears to be hedging its bet on who'll get top billing. Chris Boden, the veteran Chicago sportscaster who's been filling in at WGN since last August, and Kaitlin Sharkey, the former sports anchor and Chicago Bears reporter at Fox-owned WFLD-Channel 32, were named full-time sports anchor/reporters Tuesday. Boden's promotion is effective immediately, while Sharkey joins the station Monday. The announcement by WGN news director Dominick Stasi did not delineate specific duties for Boden and Sharkey, suggesting the two may alternate in Roan's old role for the time being. If the plan is for one or the other eventually to emerge as top sports staff. In addition to Roan, who retired last week after 38 years at the station, an earlier opening was created when Lauren Magiera was not renewed after six years as sports anchor/reporter in April. "We are excited to welcome Kaitlin Sharkey to the sports team and to have Chris join us officially," Stasi said in a brief statement. "Both will be great assets as part of Chicago's Very Own." Boden, 59, who grew up in south suburban Burbank and graduated from Luther South High School and Columbia College, has been a solid performer on Chicago TV and radio for nearly four decades, including a long run on the former Comcast Sports Chicago). Sharkey, 31, a Milwaukee native and graduate of the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee, joined Fox 32 in 2020 from WITI, the Fox affiliate in Milwaukee. Lauren was born in Chicago, Illinois US in 1982, and while the exact date of her birth is not known, she holds American nationality and follows the Christian religion. Lauren is best known for working as an anchor for WGN News. Early life and educationShe spent her childhood in Chicago with her parents Dan and Karen Jiggetts - her father work as a host and analyst for Comcast Sports Net Chicago, so one can say that Lauren inherited her love towards broadcasting from her father - he was also very sportive as he played for the Chicago Bears football club as an offensive lineman from 1976 to 1982. After she matriculated from Stevenson High School located in Lincolnshire, she enrolled at Harvard University and graduated magna cum laude four years later. Lauren's father, Dan Jiggetts was born in Brooklyn, New York City USA, on 10 March 1954 and is mostly known for his career with the Chicago Bears American Football team. Dan initially enrolled at Ohio State University, but changed his mind and entered Harvard University instead - he did this to honor his mother's last wish as she died just four days after he matriculated from Westhampton Beach High School. While at Harvard, Dan played as an offensive tackle for the college team, and was named All-Ivy League three times and All-East two times. He was eventually inducted into the Hall of Fame of the Harvard University for being the first African-American captain of Harvard's football team, and helped get the team to the Ivy League Championship in 1975. In 1976, he began playing for the Chicago Bears, in 98 games until 1982 when he went to play for the Chicago Blitz for one season, and then for San Antonio Gunslingers for a season as well - he decided to retire in 1985. He didn't want to leave the NFL completely, and therefore became a sports analyst for CBS - he was a co-host of "Monsters and Money in the first half of 2010.Today, Dan is hosting a couple of shows on the Comcast Sports Net Chicago.Lauren Jiggetts with father DanCareerBecause Lauren was one of the best students of her class, she had no trouble finding a good job as soon as she got her degree - she began working for Channel is one of the most watched there and has won numerous awards, so one can easily say that her first job was also one of the best she's had in her career.At the same time, Lauren was working for the United Nations, covering breaking national news for them - she was reporting from the NASA's Jet Propulsion Lab.She then made a big jump from Channel One and the UN to MTV Studios, where she served as part of the anti-discrimination campaign, but didn't stay long as she soon began working for NBC 5 - an Emmy Award. She is also the holder of several local Emmy Awards, and won the Irv Kupcinet Media Award at the 41 Annual Ed Kelly Foundation Gala in 2015. She worked for NBC 5 for more than 10 years, and then became part of WGN TV's team - she left NBC 5 with these words: 'This was a difficult decision for me to make, but I think it is the right one. I have been with WMAQ for 10 years and have greatly enjoyed my time there. My life has changed dramatically since the day I joined WMAQ and I believe, as hard as it is to leave, this is the right decision for me personally.' She is currently working for the WGN TV station as the anchor of their Morning News.WGN TV stationWGN virtual channel 9 is an independent TV station which operates from Chicago, Illinois - it plays a key role in the Tribune Broadcasting which is part of the Willis Tower in the Chicago Loop.WGN-TV was the second US TV station to ever become available by satellite transmission to its subscribers throughout the whole nation in 1978. Her other half works at Pyramis Global Advisors as their research analyst -the company is part of the Fidelity Investments group based in Smithfield in Rhode Island. Micah joined Chicago's WGN-TV in January 1998 as a WGN Morning News co-anchor and medical reporter. Micah has anchored all of the newscasts at WGN, as well as covering entertainment news and special assignment stories, including the historic inauguration of America's first black President. In addition, Micah reports and co-produces the "Chicago's Very Own" bi-weekly segment for WGN News and she is the host of WGN's public affairs program, "People to People". Micah is one of Chicago's very own as she was born here and grew up in the city. Micah spent eight years at WJBK-TV in Detroit where she was a main anchor and general assignment reporter. While at WJBK, Micah's work garnered numerous awards and accolades, including an Emmy and an award from the Michigan Association of Broadcasters. Prior to moving to the Motor City, Micah cut her teeth in Cedar Rapids, Iowa as a general assignment reporter and weekend anchor. She began her career in broadcasting in 1983 at NPR affiliate, WBEZ radio in Chicago/Midwest Emmy, and was also honored as being a diversity trailblazer by Barnes and Thornburg LLP. She has been featured in several local and national publications over the years, including the New York Times Magazine, Glamour, Ebony, Good Housekeeping, Today's Chicago Woman, 'Who's Who' in Black Chicago, Michigan Avenue Magazine and RedEye. She serves as commentator, mistress of ceremonies and honorary chairperson to several community and civic organizations across Chicagoland. When the show expanded in 2013, she extended her duties again to cover the 6-10 am hours. In addition to anchoring, Robin enjoys reporting on stories unique to Chicago and the South Side. Prior to joining WGN-TV, Robin worked at Shadow Broadcast Services in Chicago. During that time, she worked as a traffic, news and sports reporter for WLUP Radio's Jonathon Brandmeier Show. She also worked as a traffic reporter for WLUP Radio's degree in broadcast journalism from the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign and is a proud Illini alumna. She is a lifelong Chicagoan, born and raised in South suburban Burbank, and has two daughters.
