I have nothing but positive things to say about Puffin's Android TV, and there is absolutely no reason to browse the internet about anything else. 2. Mozilla Firefox browser for Android TV, most of my benchmark tests of Firefox for Android TV show the best shows of any "main" web browser. When you combine these shows with the ability to sync all your brands and passwords across all devices, it's easy to see why Firefox is second on this list. I'm a big fan of dark themes, especially on Android devices. While not as good as we initially thought, dark mode consumes less energy and feels refreshing. When you navigate to the page, the URL and search band remain at the bottom of the screen, but all other buttons and menu disappear. The biggest downside to Firefox's Android TV is that it requires the use of an airplane mouse. Since the download app is located on the Google Play Store, it can be easily installed on almost any Android TV device. Performance is good as the bootloader fails in most benchmarks. You can disable JavaScript via the menu options to speed things up, which will prevent some sites from loading. The downloader can be used with a regular TV as the app shows a small red circle as a cursor. You can move the circle around the website using only the remote's D-PAD. Opera for Android, although Opera has Aptoide TV, it doesn't seem to be compatible with my nvidia shield, especially Firefox. It seems that more effort is needed to make the play look good on the big screen. The UI looks identical to the desktop version and doesn't translate well to Android TV. Navigation was very awkward using the Android TV remote, but got better when I switched to an air mouse. Without a cursor, it's nearly impossible to tell where you're clicking around the room. In terms of performance, Opera took center stage in almost every test. It could have been better, but it wasn't the slowest. Between the clunky interface and mediocre performance, Opera was really disappointing on Android TV. However, I still liked it better than chrome. 5. Google Chrome for Android I've always wondered why Google never made an Android TV version of the popular Chrome browser. Therefore, the only way we can install Chrome on our Android TVs is by reloading. Even then there are some problems. UPDATE: You can see my tutorial where I walk you step by step to install Google Chrome on Android TV. Let's start with the goodMost of us use Google Chrome for at least some. Like Firefox, you can sync all your settings, bookmarks, and passwords across devices. Performance is good. Google Chrome was second only to Puffin in the speed indicator test and finished in the middle of the pack for the other tests. No problem, as it is an application optimized for Android smartphones, not Android TV. Now let's talk about the bad and the ugly. Webxprt 3 Finally, we have webxprt, which has become one of the most popular browser tests of the last decade. He tests browser performance with HTML 5 and JavaScript in several ways. As a speed indicator, it is designed for daily tasks such as image processing, sorting, encryption of files, creation of graphics, etc. It is also preferable to use higher values. Puffin again took the lead with a maximum score of 100. The rest of the Android TV browsers finished in the cluster with notes between 52 and 58. The other web browsers I tested had more or less very similar performance. I was surprised to see how Downloader compares to giants like Firefox and Opera.
